Key Messages

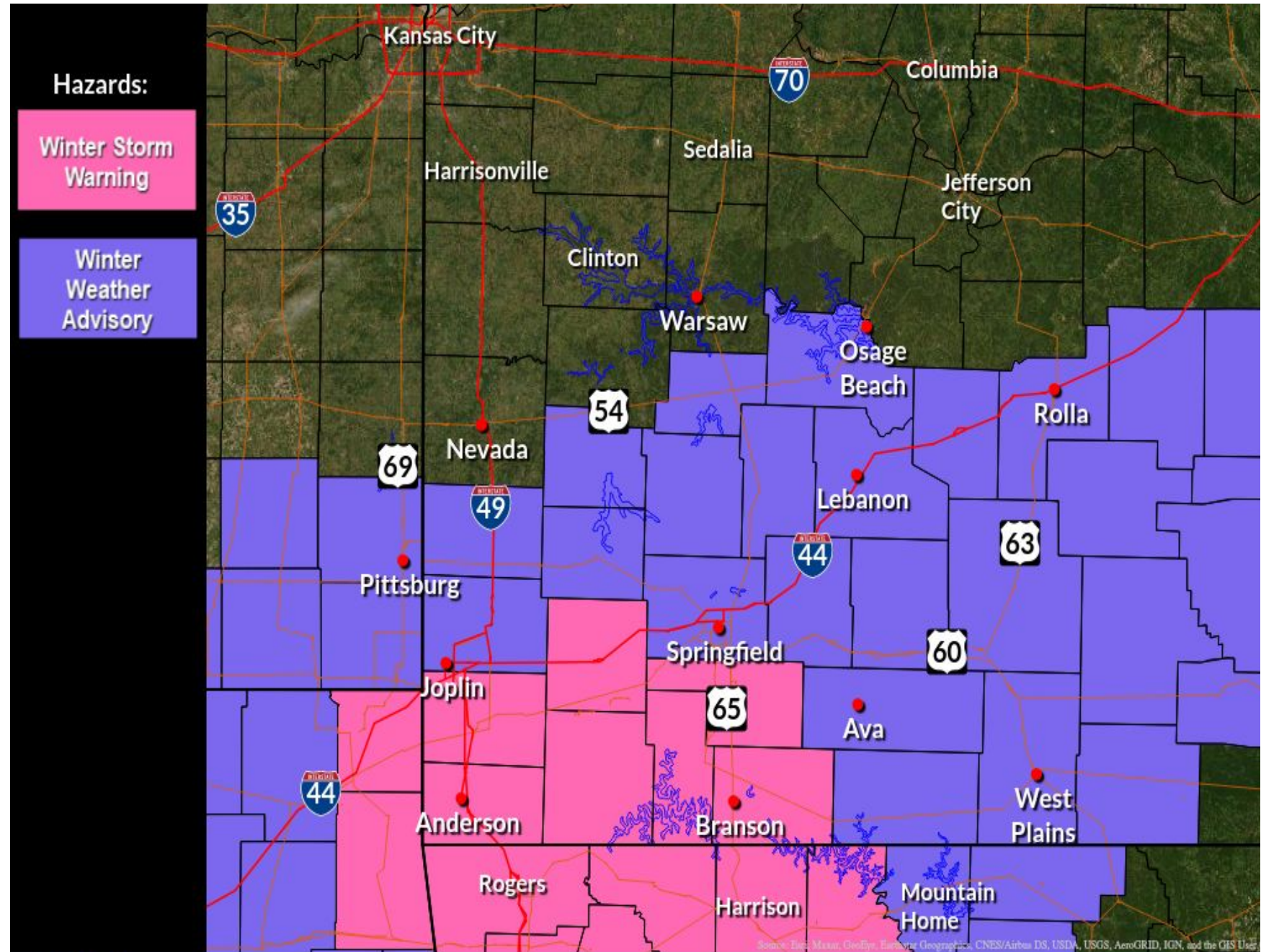
- A narrow band of moderate to heavy snow will move across southern Missouri.
- Snowfall amounts will be highly variable, with several inches possible where the band persists longer and little to no snowfall elsewhere.

Forecast Snowfall Amounts

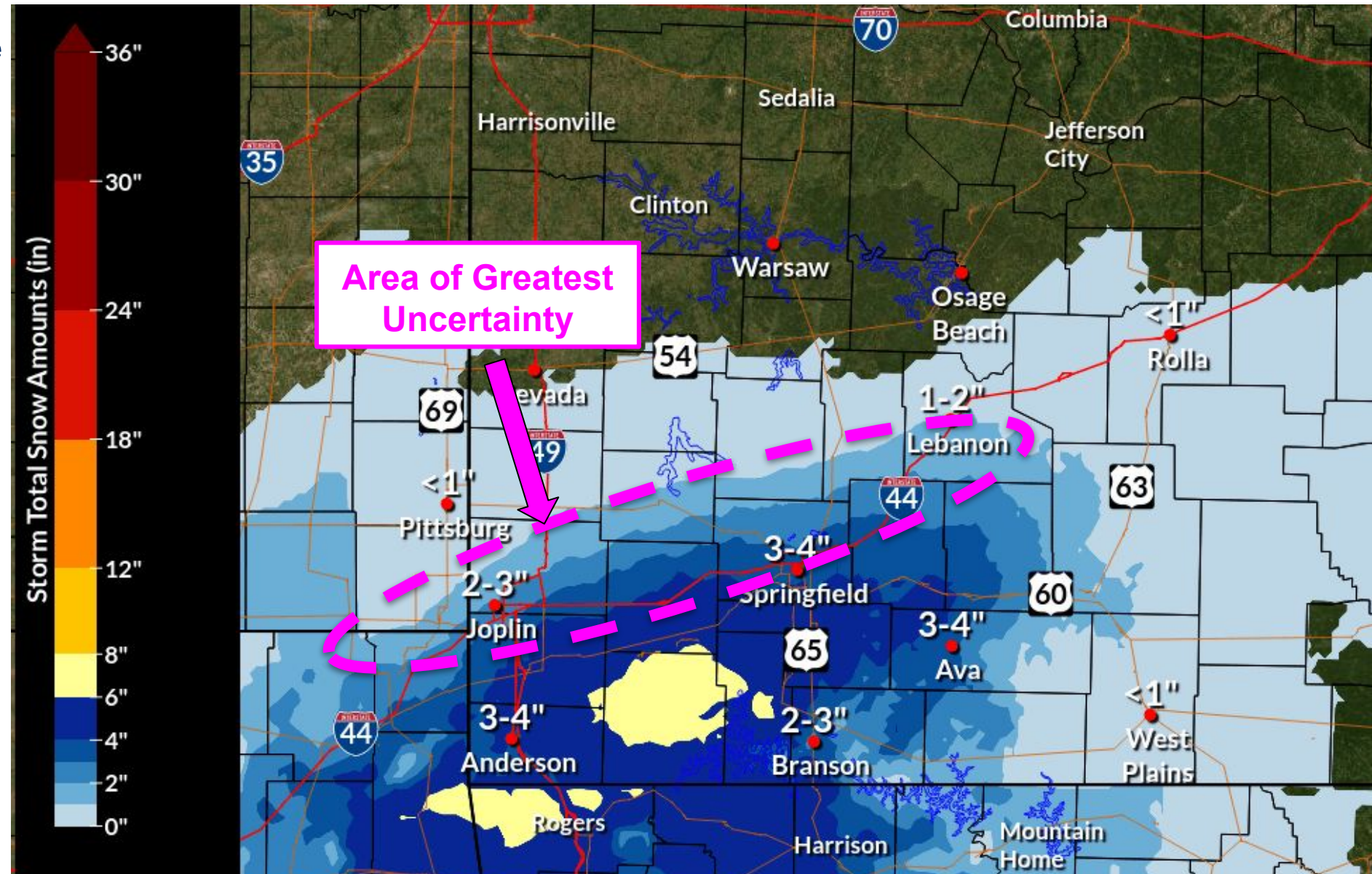

Forecast Snowfall Amounts

Key Messages

- A moderate to heavy snow band will continue to move across southern Missouri this morning. Hourly snowfall rates of 1-2 inches per hour are possible under heavier bands.
- As the band moves east into south-central Missouri it will weaken and temperatures will be warmer so little to no snow accumulation is expected.
- Localized higher and lower amounts are expected. The area of greatest uncertainty is along Interstate 44 from Joplin to Lebanon.
- Due to warm ground temperatures and air temperatures near freezing, some portion of the snowfall will melt as it falls.



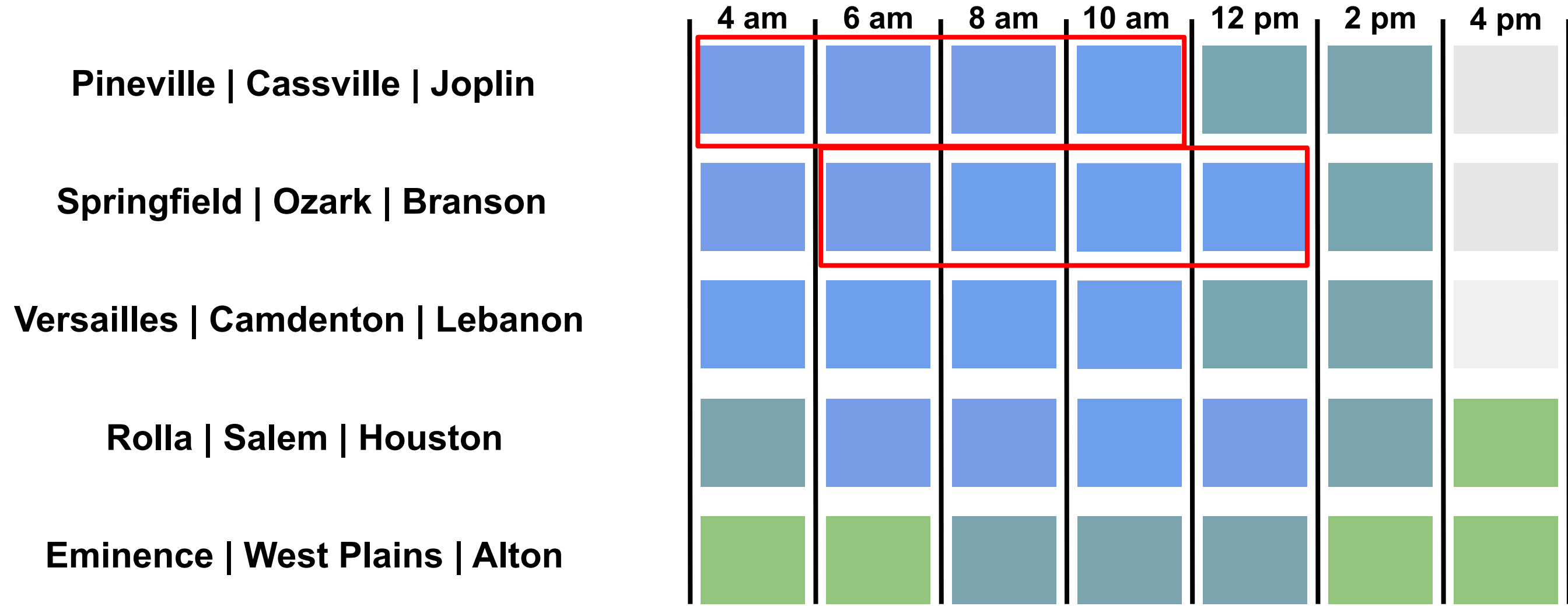


Timeline of Precipitation Today

ICE & SNOW, TAKE IT SLOW
