Key Messages

- Strong to severe storms today into this \rightarrow evening.
- Hail to the size of golf balls and \rightarrow damaging wind gusts up to 60 mph will be the main risks.
- Isolated tornado risk mainly over south \rightarrow central Missouri.



Important Updates

- Bumped eastern portions of the area up \rightarrow into a level 3 enhanced risk
- Slight risk (level 2) increased further \rightarrow west to east of a Joplin to Nevada line.

Strong to Severe Storms

Today into this evening

Hazards: Large hail up to golf ball size, damaging wind gusts up to 60 mph and isolated tornadoes.



Areas Impacted: Areas mainly east of a Joplin to Nevada line with areas in the eastern Ozarks having the highest risk later this afternoon and early evening.



Timing & Duration: From mid morning through the early evening. Generally spreading east and the risk remaining in a certain location for 3 to 4 hours.



Impacts: Hail may cause damage to roofs and cars. Wind damage may cause trees and power lines to blow down along with some structural damage to homes.


Overview


A cold front will push through with strong to severe storms developing along the front. All modes of severe storms will be possible.

Be weather aware and ready to act. Have multiple ways to receive warning information!










SPC Outlook Day 1 Hazard Probs



Damaging Winds


Large Hail
