Key Messages


- Multiple rounds of storms will move through the region Today through Sunday.








Friday's Conditional Severe Hazards

Low Confidence

What


→ Widespread rainfall is expected with localized pockets of 1.5-3 inches.

Where

→ Confidence is low with the placement of the heaviest amounts however it does favor areas west of Springfield.

When

→ This morning and afternoon. Another round of thunderstorms is then expected overnight.




Low Confidence Rainfall Totals Today through Tonight

Saturday's Severe Outlook

What

→ The highest potential for severe storms Saturday will be west of the area. Storms that are able to move in from the west could produce large hail, damaging winds and tornadoes.

When

→ Severe storms could move into the area from the west during the afternoon and evening however the highest chances are Saturday Night.





Saturday - Sat Night Flood Potential


Mainly west of Springfield

What/Where

- → Slight risk of excessive rainfall/flooding west of Springfield.
- → Higher risk across northeast Oklahoma.

When

→ Highest potential for thunderstorms and any flooding would be Saturday night into early Sunday morning.





Sunday's Severe Outlook

What

→ The entire area has a risk for large hail, damaging winds and tornadoes on Sunday.

When

Severe storms could be ongoing during the morning with additional development during the afternoon if enough heating develops behind the morning storms.



Severe and Flood Confidence Levels

Overall Severe Threat Evolution



Significant Severe Potential Sat Night



Location of heaviest rainfall amounts



Rises on area creeks/rivers



Confidence Details

- → The overall evolution of the severe and flooding threat the next few days is low as the area will continuously be on the edge of the higher threat areas.
- → There does seem to be increasing confidence in higher severe chances for our area Saturday night as storms move in from Kansas.

Alternate Scenarios

- → If thunderstorms continue to move over the same areas then the flash flooding risk would increase.
- → The thunderstorm coverage Friday evening and during the day Saturday could be low if clouds limit heating/instability.
